FINANCIAL AID DEADLINE

To be considered for need-based financial aid, a student must complete and submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by **February 1**, our priority financial aid deadline. Do not wait to be admitted to the University of Maryland before submitting the FAFSA. We strongly recommend that a completed FAFSA be submitted as soon as possible after January 1. The FAFSA can be completed online at www.fafsa.ed.gov.

APPLICATION CHECKLIST

We are pleased that you are interested in applying for undergraduate admission to the University of Maryland. Students who graduated from high school and subsequently attempted at least 12 semester hours or 18 quarter hours in a regular term at a regionally accredited college or university are considered transfer applicants. **Successful transfer applicants demonstrate better-than-average grades in strong academic courses and completion of Fundamental Studies English and mathematics.**

1. **Application:** Complete the application. You may apply online at www.admissions.umd.edu or print, complete, sign and mail the PDF of the application to the address below.
2. **Application Fee:** Include a nonrefundable application fee of \$55 (payable to the University of Maryland).
 - Include the student's name and date of birth on the check, money order or credit card slip. We accept the following credit cards: Visa, American Express, MasterCard and Discover. We regret that we cannot honor debit cards or cash.
 - If you apply online, you may pay with a credit card (our Web site is protected by VeriSign) or be billed by the university separately.
3. **College Transcripts:** Request an official copy of all of your college transcripts be sent directly to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions by the registrar(s) of all former colleges. Any international transcripts must be in your native language with certified English translations. A final, official transcript must also be sent upon completion of any courses in progress.
4. **High School Transcripts and Test Scores:** If you have completed fewer than 30 semester or 45 quarter hours, request than an official copy of your high school transcript, as well as all SAT I and/or ACT scores for students who graduated high school in the last three years, be sent directly to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions. Official test scores must be sent directly from the Educational Testing Service (SAT I code for Maryland is 5814) or the ACT program (ACT code for Maryland is 1746). Students with any foreign secondary school credentials must provide academic records in the original language with a certified English translation.
5. **Essay:** Submit a personal statement describing why you wish to transfer, explaining academic challenges and/or future goals. Your essay should be no more than 300 words.
6. **Supplemental Information:** Submit an optional résumé or statement of your academic extracurricular activities.
7. **Track your status online:** After submitting your application, track your status online at www.admissions.umd.edu. This Web site enables you to view a listing of documents received by the admissions office and monitor the completeness of your application. Because of the high volume of mail we receive, we cannot list documents the day they are received. There will be periods of time, especially as due dates approach, when documents may take several weeks to process.

TRANSFER CREDIT

The University of Maryland accepts transfer credits taken only from regionally accredited institutions. The acceptance of credit will be determined by Maryland's Transfer Credit Center after an offer of admission is extended. You can visit the transfer credit center online at www.tce.umd.edu.

HIGH SCHOOL INFORMATION AND STANDARDIZED TESTING

If you have completed fewer than 30 semester or 45 quarter hours, request that an official copy of your final high school transcript (as well as SAT I and/or ACT scores for students who graduated high school in the past three years) be sent directly to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions. Students with any non-U.S. secondary school credentials must provide academic records in the original language with a certified English translation.

Students who did not graduate from a regionally accredited high school must submit official results of the Tests of General Education Development (GED). Students who were home-schooled should provide a transcript complete with course descriptions, books used, methods of evaluation and grades received.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Non-immigrants currently holding or intending to seek an F-1 or J-1 visa must complete a different application—the International Transfer Application available online at www.admissions.umd.edu.

NON-NATIVE ENGLISH SPEAKERS

If English is not your native language—regardless of citizenship—you must provide the university with verification of your proficiency in English. Scoring 480 or higher on the critical reading section of the SAT I or completing the Associate of Arts (A.A.) degree exempts you from this requirement. **Transfer credit for an English composition course does not waive the English proficiency exam.** Non-native speakers of English who have received a degree from an institution in the United States; English-speaking countries in Africa or the commonwealth of the Caribbean; or English-speaking Australia, Canada, Ireland,

New Zealand or the United Kingdom may be exempt from proving fluency. All others should have an official report of their scores from the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) sent directly to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions by the appropriate application deadline noted on page A.

NON-U.S. ACADEMIC CREDENTIALS

Applicants with non-U.S. academic credentials must provide all academic records—secondary and college/university—in the original language with a certified English translation. Applicants who have attended secondary school outside of the United States need to provide, where appropriate, official results and certificate of completion from a national secondary school examination (such as the GCSE or Baccalaureate). Please note the deadlines on page A.

VISAS

Applicants holding non-immigrant visas, other than F-1 Student or J-1 Exchange Visitor, need to submit a photocopy of their I-94 Arrival/Departure Record and visa stamp.

APPLICATION DATES

Please note the earlier application deadlines for U.S. citizens and permanent residents with any foreign academic records. **All documents must be submitted by the deadlines on page A to be considered for admission for a particular term.**

GOLDEN IDENTIFICATION PROGRAM

The University of Maryland participates in the Golden Identification Program, and makes available courses and various services to persons who are 60 or older, who are legal residents of the state of Maryland, and who are retired (not engaged in gainful employment for more than 20 hours per week). If admitted to the university, they register on a space-available basis for credit courses as regular or special students in any term, and pay an administrative fee for each semester registered.

NONDEGREE-SEEKING
